Kindergarten! ... here I come!



Some information about kindergarten :

- Children can start kindergarten in 2023 if they are 5 years old, or if they turn 5 before 31st July 2023.
- Children should start school at the beginning of the school year.
- Children must be in a school system by their 6th birthday.
- When enrolling a child, a birth certificate is required for identification.
- A good start in kindergarten helps a child feel confident in the classroom and allows them to practise important social skills.

Attendance tips-

- Try to schedule health appointments or check-ups, haircuts and other appointments in the school holidays or after school hours.
- Unavoidable appointments during the school hours are best made for the afternoons or early morning. Missing an hour or school is better than missing a whole day.
- If you must travel because your child has an unavoidable medical appointment on a school day, try to schedule in other appointments on the same day, eg - doctor and optometrist on same day.
